Prez Says April 2015

We have wrapped up our first ever trip to New Orleans. We had quite a time. We picked our timing to coincide with the French Quarter Festival, which had been highly recommended to us. It is a free festival showcasing many of the local bands and musicians. It turned out to be a very popular time to be visit. The crowds were large and enthusiastic. The weather was very warm and humid initially and then later that week it cooled down and rained.

We attended portions of the festival, which were punctuated by periods of rain. This did not deter the crowds, who responded by donning their rain panchos and erecting their umbrellas.

We were able to catch up with some of our musical friends from the festivals. While wandering down Bourbon Street we spied Dave Ruffner (Blue Street) playing in a combo at Café Beignet. We greeted him warmly and he told us that he is looking forward to playing our Sunday session in August.

In the evenings, we hung out on Frenchmen Street. This avenue sports a continuous string of restaurants and bars, all of which host live music, mostly jazz. We got to see Molly Reeves performing in her New Orleans band, the "New Orleans Jazz Vipers". What a great band that was and a real treat to catch up with her.

We went on the "Steamboat Natchez" for the dinner cruise, featuring music by the "Dukes of Dixieland". This band has been performing in some form since 1948. We have some old albums of theirs at our house that belonged to Jeff's parents. The evening on the Natchez was one of my favorites.

Looking through one of the entertainment newspapers, I saw that Tom Hook was playing at a place called "The Bombay Club". Tom Hook! He will be appearing at our festival for the first time this year. I have seen him at other festivals and enjoyed him so much that I lobbied strongly to hire him. Here he was in New Orleans, playing at a piano bar. I made a reservation and we went. The bar is made to look like a library. Unlike every other place in New Orleans that weekend, it was not crowded. We managed to drag our dinner out for the entire time that Tom was playing and had a wonderful time there.

Everywhere we went, we had excellent service. The people of New Orleans really know how to take care of their customers. The City itself is a little tattered around the edges, but its inhabitants really want you to return.

Aside from walking the quarter and watching an endless supply of bands, we went on two tours. The Swamp Tour took us through the bayou and backwaters outside of the city. We got to see the wildlife, including alligators, up close. The boat operator and guide was extremely knowledgeable and entertaining.

We also went on a bus tour of the city and the areas damaged by Katrina. The guide on this tour gave a vivid and heartrending account of the events leading up to and following Katrina. We got to see first-hand the ravages of the flood and the optimism of the rebuilding effort. This guide had lived through the storm and the aftermath, which made it very real for his audience.

A final mention is the World War II Museum. This immense gallery of in-depth depictions of events and artifacts surrounding WW II takes at least a day to fully digest. It is well worth the effort. Regardless of your familiarity of the history of this massive campaign, this museum provides additional insight to every facet and front of the war.

After a full week in NO, it was time to return to California. New Orleans was an awesome and overwhelming experience, both musically and historically. I will continue to mentally process our trip in the weeks to come. We had some great times while we were there and I am inspired by new musical possibilities. Meanwhile, it is good to be home.

We'll see you at our Sunday session and see what this New York jazz band has to offer. J




Sunshine Point of Contact


