## Prez Says September 2015

It's time for the annual BSR BBQ (formerly Peek Neek) on September 27th. This BBQ is a tradition that started many years ago as a way to give back the membership and the volunteers that keep the club running. Accordingly, all participants are charged only a nominal amount to cover the cost of the BBQ and the entertainment. The bands this year will be mainly comprised of BSR members, "Clam Chowder" and "The Amigos".

Jeff and I really look forward to throwing this event every year. We bought our house in Orcutt primarily for the property. We always entertained when we lived in Long Beach, and we knew that the house we chose on the Central Coast would allow us to throw any kind of party we could imagine. The gazebo that we use for the stage was already there, although it was facing the other way and was considerably smaller. It had allegedly been used to house a former owner's grandson.

One of the first projects we undertook was to drag the gazebo around to face our yard. It worked great as a stage and we used it in its original configuration for many years. Over the last five years, however, the stage area has grown. First Jeff expanded the deck by about five feet and later the roof, giving us much more room for the performers. He also constructed a little drum riser which is housed inside. Sometimes we move that to our patio, when the weather is cold and we are having a smaller party.

Another project is the dance floor. We had been borrowing plywood from a lumberyard in Atascadero for many years, with the help of Russ Wright. They had the same pieces of plywood, which they leant us year after year. This was very generous of them, but it necessitated two trips to Atascadero. Two years ago, BSR purchased its own plywood, which we store. Jeff made cut-outs to go around our trees. Every year, those cut-outs get a little bit bigger. He varnished all of the boards to keep it looking good each time we use it.

Another great help to us is our neighbor, Craig Smith, who has been letting us use his empty lot to park in every year. This is especially helpful because there is no parking on the street in front of our houses. Hummel used to dead-end past Craig's lot, and when they built the road, it greatly reduced the size of our front yards. To minimize the damage, we asked that parking lanes not be included. Craig has plans to develop his lot one of these days, but in the meantime, he continues to let us use it. Last year, our neighbors to the south, the Lewotsky's, also let us park in their yard. The bottom line is that we offer a lot of off-street parking, through the good graces of our neighbors. We reserve the spaces on our property for handicapped parking. We offer golf cart service to help bring people from the other two lots, as well as further down the road or on the side streets from Hummel.

We know that Orcutt is a little far for some of you to drive, but we really want you to come. You can bring your friends, too. Some people who may not want to attend a regular Sunday session may be more than happy to come to a BBQ. Once they hear the music, they might be inspired to join the club. 
