The Royale Garden Jazz Band

The six-member Royale Garden Jazz Band plays the traditional jazz of the early 20th century, as well as many popular tunes of the 1920's & 30's. They play the upbeat happy music that makes people smile and tap their toes, as well as the slower and more pensive songs from that era. One listener described their music as a cross between a New Orleans Preservation Hall style band and a Las Vegas lounge band.

The RGJB is one of three representative bands of the Covina based Society for the Preservation of Dixieland Jazz and is in great demand all over Southern California for private parties, civic events, graduations, weddings, birthdays, funerals, street fairs, concerts in the park, Mardi Gras celebrations, chili cook-offs, festivals, as feature band for various jazz clubs, and anyplace people gather to celebrate! The band has fun while playing and is invariably thought of as "the band that shares the joy of the music with the audience."

Rag Bone Saints

Rag Bone Saints is a band based in San Luis Obispo that celebrates the traditional jazz common to the streets, bars and back alleys of New Orleans. Its members are Will Newey (sousaphone), Paul Trent (percussion), Rebecca McKinley (trombone), Gary Arcemont (banjo, vocals), Alisa Bredensteiner (guitar, vocals), Geoffrey Land (trumpet, vocals), & our own Del Gomes (clarinet).

Rag Bone Saints plays locally on the streets of San Luis Obispo, at parties, in parades and pretty much anywhere they get a chance to play. Fernie & John Ferrari ran sound. **Set 2** included these changes. Geo Smith on Trumpet, David Farber, alto sax, Richard Woodworth, soprano sax, Dean Krikorian tenor sax, Tom on tuba, Del Gomes on piano, Ken Heiges & Matt split on drums, Anne Abler on washboard and Joel Siegel, violin. Paul on Trombone. Dee on Banio. Frank on Guitar, Del was the Jazz Master. Fernie, John Ferrari ran sound. Featured songs included "Ice Cream", with Richard on vocals, "Bring me Sunshine" with Barbara K. on vocals, "It's a sin to tell a lie" w/ Tom "rappin' out " vocals, "Way down yonder", w/ Sandy on vocals. Set 3 included these changes: Del on Clarinet. Paul Buscaino. trombone. Richelle Cross on piano, Fernie on drums. Mac on Tuba, Del remains the jazz master. Jim ran sound. Featured songs included "Baby Won't You Please Come Home" w/ George on vocals, "Goody, Goody" w/Sandy on vocals.

Jazz Book Report:

Good Morning Blues: The Autobiography of Count Basie (1985). Random House. 399 pp.

This month's historical adventure recounts the life of Count Basie, as told to Alfred Murray. William Basie was born in 1904 in Red Bank, NJ. He dropped out of school at 16 to join Vaudeville acts & traveling shows, but had a steady gig playing piano behind silent movies. He settled in Harlem around 1925 and began following in the footsteps of Fats Waller, who took a liking to the young lad and would occasionally let him sit in or play behind Harlem movie theaters. Basie also took tips from the immortal Willie "The Lion" Smith and James P. Johnson during his time in Harlem during its heyday of jazz. Important is his apprenticeship time spent learning jazz (in this case, from Jazz Legends).

Basie was never much of a sight reader. He played by feel and had an excellent ear. His uncanny sense of timing and sparse phrases were more of "groove embellishments" that helped glue his bands together. He was a member of the band and he knew how to arrange a tune to suit the talents of his musicians. In a Basie band, each musician was treated as an equal. Perhaps this is why they starved so much early on.

In 1928 he joined the now-famous Oklahoma City Blue Devils and when this bad disbanded (despite being hailed as the "best ever" by some accounts)., he joined Bennie Moten's Band (even though Moten was a also pianist). You see, Basie had a determination about him, that he would persevere through difficult times: He would out work the other guy.

After Moten unexpectedly passed, Basie started a band at the Reno Club in 1935, then formed the basis of his first Big Band in the 1936, including Lester Young, Herschel Evans, Eddie Durham, Jo Jones, & even Billie Holiday. After WWII depleted most of his musicians, he broke up the band, and then started anew in 1952, due to the constant nagging of Billy Eckstine. This latter group has remained in tact and principle for the last 65 years & "Counting:" The Count Basie Orchestra played last month in Santa Barbara: Basie lives, & always swings.
