The Night Blooming Jazzmen was formed in October 1975 to represent the Society for the Preservation of Dixieland Jazz at the third Sacramento Jubilee. The NBJ was started as an ad hoc "pick-up band." It was not expected to survive, but the NBJ was so well-received and had so much fun that they stuck together. Since then they have played thousands of concerts and performed on several dozen cruises and land trips. The Night Blooming Jazzmen is one of the busiest bands in the nation. Book Review: Lester Leaps In (2002) By Douglas Henry Daniels, Ph.D.

For those of you not familiar with Lester "The Prez" Young, he was a tenor sax/lead soloist for Count Basie's Band in the 1940s. Dr. Daniels is an Emeritus Professor from UCSB and he dedicated much of his research life to studying Lester Young and the Oklahoma City Blue Devils. All told this book was over 500 pages long. So there's a lot to review.

Lester Young (1909-1959) grew up near New Orleans and joined his father's traveling band at a pre-teen age. He performed at circus shows and other Vaudeville-type acts. He was trained by his father to read music and perform, but Lester soon found his own voice as a soloist. He began to focus on the tenor sax and had the rare ability to read music and play by ear.

By the time he was 18, Lester was playing on his own with several territorial bands and beginning to build his reputation. In 1932 he joined the famous Oklahoma City Blue Devils and later followed Count Basie when he formed his own band from many of its members. Lester was soon a featured soloist known for his beauty and creativity. His ability to improvise was legendary based on an infamous "cutting contest," where he was said to roundly defeat Coleman Hawkins, then considered the King of the Tenor Sax. Lester never really relinquished his title in his lifetime, although his life was full of sadness.

He was detained and beaten while in the army for 2 years during WWII, an experience that scarred him for life. He never really had any money and lived a rough life on the road. He began abstaining from alcohol, but eventually gave in to this vice. Like his close (yet platonic) friend, Billie Holiday, his life seem destined for tragedy.

The legend of Lester Young has grown since his passing, he was the original hip cat who could solo like no other. Charlie Parker sited him as a profound influence. Charles Mingus wrote one of his most famous tunes "Goodbye Porkpie Hat," to honor the Prez. His music lives on, if you have the time, check it out.
