Presenting top-quality big band and dance music with a more-than-casual nod to the great American standards, the Starlight Dreamband performs various styles of highly popular music. Spearheaded by Robert Alberts and Mitch Latting, Starlight Dreamband plays the 4th and 5th Saturdays of each month at the Madonna Inn in SLO. Back by popular demand, they were a big hit last year. Featuring longtime BSR favorites Ron McCarley (The Professor) on saxes/flute and Darrell (The Boss) Voss on percussion, this band always has a pleasant surprise in store.

The Santa Ynez High School Band

The Santa Ynez High School Jazz Band is the newest addition to the roster of fine school bands that get the honor and opportunity to perform for BSR. Founded by Les Rose, retired director of the Dos Pueblos bands, the Santa Ynez HS Jazz Band is steeped in the tradition of classic swing music, performing works by Duke Ellington, Count Basie, Glenn Miller, and Benny Goodman, along with classic Latin dance music of cha cha and rhumba. This enthusiastic group of young musicians is extremely excited about their debut with the Basin St. Regulars as the Intermission Band on Sunday, March 25th. Les Rose is considered one of the best arrangers in the area. When asked about his method, he replied, "The melody has to be going on somewhere." Note this when the band is playing. Les also taught a well-received jazz seminar at the 2017 Jubilee. Hardy and Judy Hearns and Pat Yankee headlined the eager audience. Try to make it next year to Les's master class. Fun learning! That's Les Rose.

February Recap

February was our Mardi Gras month, which we celebrated with decorations, beads, parasol parades, and New Orleans-inspired tunes during the jam set and the guest band performances. The jam set was peppered with songs about New Orleans and we were joined on stage by many members of the Santa Maria High School Jazz Band. There are many excellent players in this band, and they truly represented the trad jazz vibe on stage and off. In keeping with the festivities, they all sported white parasols and joined the parades in force if the music was right.

The Black Market Sextet performed admirably, starting off with some Latin Jazz tunes to let us know their roots, but then veering into trad, and entertaining us with old standards like St. James Infirmary and newer hits such as Iko Iko. Many of their tunes inspired grand parasol parades in the true tradition of N'Orleans.

The Heaven Central Jazz Band from Santa Maria High was outstanding. They played more modern jazz standards but executed them extremely well. This band was nominated by the Mayor of Santa Maria to participate in the 4th of July parade in Washington, for which they are feverishly fundraising. We helped out when we passed the hat, collecting \$407 in addition to the usual \$200 stipend. This is part of our charter and we thank you all for your generosity. We hope that they can make it and will circulate news about any additional events for Heaven Central. They can jam!

The day wrapped up with the final set of Black Market. Many members stayed to wring the last drops of music out of the day. The dancing continued. More parasol parades. The bar did extremely well. We are all looking forward to the March 25th Sunday Session.

Jazz Jubilee 2018 Press Release, Part II, October 25-28, 2018

Last month's newsletter featured Blue Street Jazz Band, Au Brothers, and Tom Hook and the Terriers, along with new bands Professor Cunningham and His Old School and Shake 'Em Up Jazz Band. Returning favorites also include the High Street Party Band, Cornet Chop Suey, the Midiri Brothers, the Night Blooming Jazzmen, the High Sierra Jazz Band, Tom Rigney and Flambeau, Sue Palmer's Motel Swing Orchestra, Ivory and Gold, We Three + 1, local favorites the Ulysses Jasz band, the Creole Syncopators, Rag Bone Saints, and, for a little extra spice, Mariachi Autlence. Our guest artists include Jeff Barnhart, Carl Sonny Leyland, Washboard Steve, Larry Scala from New Orleans, Danny Coots, Paul Ingle from Australia, Bob Schulz, and Bob Draga. In short, this is the most ambitious line-up we have ever featured. There is a band here for every palate in the music spectrum.

Building on the success of 2017, we are returning to the new venues in neighboring Arroyo Grande: Pat's Place and Ruben's Rendezvous. These hugely successful halls feature comfortable chairs, rain-proof roofs, and a temperature-controlled environment. Additionally, we are back at the Seacrest banquet room this year, which has been freshly remodeled and will be a new jewel in our crown. Our shuttle buses will be running once again between the two cities and all the venues.

We intend to feature performances in our communities in addition to special sets at nearby hotels and restaurants during the festival. For instance, we are scheduling "George's Jazz Party", where we attempt to replicate a traditional jazz jam party (à la the late Dick Gibson), by placing musicians together in impromptu jam bands. We observed that our longtime leader, George Smith, followed this tradition anyway, so we put these sessions together for a nice theme. We are also planning for some seminars and workshops at the Edgewater Hotel Skyroom.

We are a unique festival! Our friendliness precedes us. Stay tuned for details as they unfold.

We want everyone to know that the Jubilee by the Sea is still in business after 42 years, and we are growing and getting better every year. By-Laws Amendment

The Board is seeking to amend the BSR By-Laws to change the Board Member election month from November to December. This is to give the Board more time to locate new officer candidates after Jubilee by the Sea in late October. New language will be included to allow for a show-of-hands vote at the December Sunday session if certain positions are uncontested. The Board also wants to add a new inclusivity statement to allow BSR to apply for certain grants. By-laws may be amended by a two-thirds majority vote of those (Board) members present at a Business Meeting. Any amendment proposed for inclusion in the By-laws must be presented to the general membership in writing, through publication in OffBeat, the Society bulletin, at least one week prior to the Business Meeting at which the vote is to be taken. This article serves as the amendment notification of substantive (non-clerical) changes to the By-Laws. Any comments to these amendments should be sent via e-mail to Rhonda Cardinal at jwcardinal@msn.com by May 1, 2018. Significant amended text is as follows and is shown in italics:

<u>Section 1:</u> Membership is open to anyone interested in furthering the aims and objectives of the Society, and does not and shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion (creed), gender, age, national origin (ancestry), disability, marital status, sexual orientation, or military status, in any of its activities or operations. Membership is offered in 8 categories:....

ARTICLE IX – Elections

Section 1: Members may either volunteer or nominate other members for office. They shall submit these names to the Secretary not later than *November 15*. A Nominating Committee of three members shall be appointed by the President at a meeting of the Board of Directors not later than *September*. The Secretary shall submit a list of nominees to the Nominating Committee.

<u>Section 2:</u> The Nominating Committee shall prepare a slate of candidates for office to be submitted at the *November* Business Meeting. At that time, further nominations from the floor will be accepted.

<u>Section 3:</u> A complete slate of candidates will be published in the *December* issue of OffBeat, the Society bulletin.

<u>Section 4:</u> Ballots shall be available only to members in good standing at the time of admission to the *December* monthly session. *If there are no contests for an office, there can be a show of hands at the monthly session rather than ballots.* Absentee ballots may be requested in advance and must be turned in, by mail or in person, to the Secretary prior to the *January* Business Meeting. All ballots must be deposited in the ballot box prior to 3:00 PM on the day of the *January* Business Meeting.

<u>Section 5:</u> Ballots shall be counted by the Executive Committee or members of the Board of Directors before the close of the *January* Business Meeting and the results announced at the meeting and, subsequently, in the bulletin of the Society.

ARTICLE X – Terms of Office

<u>Section 1:</u> The term of office for the Executive Committee shall be for one calendar year and will commence the first day of *February*.

<u>Section 2:</u> The term of office for the Board of Directors shall be for two calendar years and will commence the first day of *February*.


