of performing the music of Jelly Roll Morton, King Oliver, Lu Watters and Turk Murphy. The band plays standards and more common swing tunes. The main goal is to please the dancers, strutters, and jazz listeners.

They offer a variety of Dixieland styles, including Marches, Blues, Ragtime and Stomps, and encourage audience participation during tunes reminiscent of the era: cakewalking, parasol strutting and to raising their voices to sing along.

This was our last school band for the year until Jubilee. Next month, our jam sessions will mostly feature BSR members and supporters. See you in June.

I first met Eva at the Rancho Nipomo BBQ during one of Jimmy Townsend's *Anything's Possible* blues jams. I was looking for sound people for Jubilee and Jimmy directed me to Eva's husband, Jerry, as a possibility. I

introduced myself, but as it was very noisy, a conversation was difficult.

I ended up speaking to Eva outside in the parking lot. She and Jerry were new to the area, having just relocated from Palmdale. She was good friends with Barbara Landis, who is Eva's brother Leroy's girlfriend. This had a lot to do with their

decision to come to the Central Coast. Barbara is a long-time volunteer for BSR and Jubilee, and Eva was familiar with the festival.

During our conversation, Eva told me that she was working at a local United Way radio station, but that she had the time and the desire to do more volunteer work. I did not waste a minute recruiting her to help out with BSR and Jubilee. I encouraged her to start attending meetings to see how we worked and then insert herself as needed.

That is exactly what she did, and she quickly found her niche, filling in, helping out, publicizing, and recruiting others. She stepped in when we needed help at the door. Eva also took over the Jubilee hotel deals and the venue concessionaires. On both of these tasks, she worked closely with Diane Brand.

She was good and kind to all people, and an excellent person to work the front door. She convinced casual visitors to join the club and providing a friendly and helpful face to all who came in. She supported other groups as well, working the Summer Concerts in the Park series in AG, along with the radio station.

She was a loving and supportive wife, mother, and grandmother, prizing family above all else. She was a very positive person to be around and never said an unkind word about anybody. If you needed help, she was there for you.

Her loss was a blow to me personally and a loss to the Club. We will fill in the gaps, but we can never replace her and we will always miss her.
