JUBILEE CORNER

This month, I would like to talk about band selection.

During the festival we distribute evaluation sheets, wherein we ask our attendees what bands they would like to see in the future and how they like the bands they just experienced. For our last festival (2018), we only asked people to evaluate the new bands and then list their top 5 of the returning bands. We felt it would simplify our tabulation process, which it did. We use this data to help us determine how our current bands fared and see which ones are the top picks for new bands. We also get verbal recommendations during the festival and throughout the year.

Band selection must begin very early in the festival cycle, so that bands can be put under contract and advertising can begin. The San Diego Jazz Festival happens Thanksgiving weekend, less than a month after Jubilee, so we quickly make up flyers with whatever information we have at the time and take hardcopies for distribution. We do not even put a printed ad in their program.

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
DEAR MEMBERS,

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There are a few bands that I consider to be cornerstones of our festival. These are bands that display a huge amount of talent and innovation year after year and can be counted on to draw an audience to every set. Some other bands are historically linked to our festival, are tied to the local community, and create an emotional bridge across the years.

If we tried a new band that performed well, or even not as well as they could, it behooves us to bring them back at least one more year before changing the roster again.

There are bands creating buzz at other festivals or in the Syncopated Times that have not appeared on the West Coast that will attract people who want to see someone different.

Important for me are bands with diversity. I strive to hire bands that have a lot more women in them or different ethnicities. I also tend to hire younger bands with fresher faces. I believe this will help us attract a younger and more diverse audience, plus I feel it is more interesting, both to me and to the audience.

All of this has to be completed very early in the year, as I have stated, so that we have something to advertise at the other festivals. Also, we need to lock in our bands so they do not go somewhere else.

Overlying all of this is the basic decision about the total number of sets we will have at our festival. How many venues, for how many hours? Over the last three years, we have reduced out total number of sets. This is to reduce the wear and tear on our volunteers, who are not tireless. We can partially offset this reduction with so-called "off-site" sets, where we place our bands in local establishments outside of our venues and pay them to perform for the public. But we are still slightly smaller than we used to be.

Having to decide on the bands so far in advance means that when we are halfway through the year and we see a really great band, either at our Sunday session or elsewhere, we cannot add them in, no matter how good they are or how much money we are offered. Our roster is full and our sets are full. We are already contracted with a full complement of bands. I know this is disappointing to those of you have approached me, but all I can do is consider them for the following year. I cannot open more venues to

accommodate more bands. Even if the money is there, the people to operate more venues are not. It takes over 150 volunteers to keep the doors open during our 3 ½ day event. We cannot manage more with the resources that we have. My apologies for having to say no to some of you. I welcome you to join the management team and lend your voice to the year-long planning process.

We can always use interested people to help us all year, because there are many tasks to manage leading up to the festival. Remember, it is all on paper until the day we set up, and this is a very intensive paper operation. If you have special skills or talents that you can contribute, please don't hesitate to join us. Our meetings are usually on a Tuesday afternoon at the Skyroom at the Edgewater at 3:00 p.m. We do not have a set meeting schedule at this time, so give me a call at
