Jubilee Corner Wrap

The 2019 Jazz Jubilee by the Sea was a real blow -out, highlighted by world-renowned New Orleans busking-band Tuba Skinny, making their first-ever West Coast festival appearance.

In addition to the Jubilee, the Thursday night San Luis Obispo farmers' market touted a free concert with the Crustacea Jazz Band, one of our faves, followed by two Tuba Skinny sets. Audience numbers there set a new record and YouTube videos posted by loyal fans have exceeded 5,000 views. Enthusiasts traveled from across the country to see their favorite band in our area's comfortable settings!

Besides Tuba Skinny, the Australian Jazz Connection generated the intense excitement that characterized this festival. I was their debut performance of an assemblage of Aussie ex-pats put together by the able and debonair Paul Ingle,

a new Friend of the Festival. Some jazz buffs traveled from Down Under to see them, an extraordinary blend of players pulling together some astounding sets with minimal rehearsal.

Another Koala Lover, the ever-popular Professor Cunningham and His Old School also graced our stages. This year they brought sexy calendars featuring the band members, which were a big hit and an instant sell-out. Their tribute to Bobby Darin was one of the high points of the festival and one of many, many incredible tribute sets performed over the weekend. The Prof also guested with the Australian Jazz Connection on their "Aussie Tunes" set.

Bob Draga performed a tribute to Pete Fountain packing the Vet's Hall, with people spilling out of the doors and into the lobby. The set was flawlessly executed, entertaining, and educational. He still has what it takes, stealing the show.

The Shake Em Up Jazz Band wowed us with their intimate mix of vocals and instrumental performances. The all-woman band hails from New Orleans, and features local hero Molly Reeves. Haruka Kikuchi, returned this year and proved why she is one of the top trombone players in the Big Easy! Other returning favorites included Cornet Chop Suey, Tom Rigney and Flambeau, the Midiri Brothers, Sue Palmer and Her Motel Swing Orchestra, Blue Street, and the ever-popular Creole Syncopators.

Another new band for us this year was Gator Nation. Their unusual and theatrical performances had the dancers in the crowd energized and left the audience wanting more.

Our local mariachi band, Mariachi Autlence, pulled out all the stops at their Sunday shows. We regularly see them perform at a local restaurant and they are always great, but they really brought it to the big tent. Their crooner worked the audience, giving special attention to all of the ladies. If you were there, you were glad you were.

There were many special blocks of sets throughout the weekend, including the New Orleans block, the USO/Big Band Swing block, Night Club, Gospel, and Rent Party. Other tributes spotlighted Benny Goodman, Louis Armstrong, Artie Shaw, and Count Basie.

We expanded our reach to include other locations within the cities of Pismo Beach and Arroyo Grande, our way of saying "Thank you" to both

cities for their generous financial contributions to our event. We sponsored free performances at local restaurants The Branch Street Deli and Puffers of Pismo, as well as at new hotels The Agrarian in Arroyo Grande and Vespara on Ocean in Pismo Beach. These performances were well attended and helped introduce our festival-goers to local businesses, as well as acquainting more locals with our unique music festival.

One of our themes (and we ended up with several this year) was a "Salute to the 90's", honoring all those in our audience and in our bands that were

90 years old or older (also known as nonagenarians). All festival attendees in that age group were given free buttons that said, "Ask me about my life." We tied this to the 75th anniversary of D-Day, celebrated in June, and all of the veterans and those that lived during World War II.

A major part of this theme was giving Pat Yankee and Chet Jaeger the royal treatment. We featured portraits of Pat and Chet (in uniform) that were taken during the war years on the cover of our program. The original painting, by local artist and graphics designer Priscilla Wilson, and an canvas copy were displayed in the lobbies of the Vet's Hall and Ruben's Rendezvous. Our last set of the festival featured Night Blooming Jazzmen with Pat Yankee appearing as a special guest.
