Members of the band reside in San Luis Obispo and Santa Barbara counties. They have been providing audiences with performances of great jazz standards as well as original jazz tunes. They have access to over 1,000 songs of various composers and arrangers.

The band rehearses most Saturday's, even during this pandemic while observing social distancing. Each time they get together for "rehearsals," they do a lot of sight reading of new music. Sight reading is the practice of reading and performing music that has not been seen or played before. The band members have years of experience playing with various groups and are delighted to be affiliated with the FNBB.

The band has performed concerts at Grace Bible Church in Arroyo Grande, Nipomo Presbyterian Church, Glen Ellen in Lompoc, Atterdag Village retirement community in Solvang, and a neighborhood concert in Grover Beach.

Jazz Jubilee by the Sea 2021 is on track and in work. We have connected with most of our bands with a few more yet to be determined to round out our festival roster.

The bands that we have contacted and are in the process of hiring are: Tom Rigney and Flambeau, Cornet Chop Suey, the Midiri Brothers Septet, Professor Cunningham and his Old School, the Molly Reeves Quartet, Sierra Seven, Blue Street, the New High Street Party Band, the Creole Syncopators, Larry, Dawn and Friends, Crescent Katz, Gino and the Lone Gunmen, and Leyland and Friends.

Our special guests this year so far are Larry Scala, Gary Ryan and Carl Sonny Leyland.

We will have special musical guests during each of our jam sessions ably led by C.J. Sams.

Dance lessons will be offered Friday morning at the Veteran's Hall.

A highly anticipated new band for our festival will be the Holland/Coots Swingin' West Band from Nashville, Tennessee. Our Thursday night show will also be new, featuring the widely acclaimed trio, Groovus (Holland, Coots and Steven Pikal) with special guest Adrian Cunningham. You do not want to miss the only performance of this musical assemblage at our festival.

In addition to some new bands, we will also be trying out some new venues in our neighboring city, Grover Beach. The Grover

Beach Community Center features wood floors throughout the facility, a generous wood floor stage, kitchen, outdoor area, onsite and street parking and a seating capacity of up to 400 people. The Ramona Park facility, also very nice, is surrounded by a park and will seat up to 200 people. Both of these facilities are close to Pismo Beach and can be accessed via the surface streets. This means that neither the buses nor the driving attendees will need to get on the freeway to shuttle between the sites.

We will have buses again, using the same highly successful bus company from 2019. SLO Safe Ride. Parking is limited at most venues, so we encourage as many as possible to make use of the buses.

Our ticket pricing will be the same as was offered in 2020, pre-Jubilee, early bird \$115 through September 15th, \$120 through October 15th and 3-day \$130 starting October 16th and at the door. Thursday night tickets \$25. Single day badges are available, \$60 for Friday, \$80 for Saturday and \$30 for Sunday. Half price badges will be available on Friday and Saturday starting at 5:00 p.m. We will continue our tradition of \$30 3-day badges for those aged 30 and under - a remarkable value.

In addition to our live in-person shows, we will also offer the opportunity to watch a Livestream of the performances from one of the venues for those that cannot attend in person. The venue location of the Livestream has not yet been determined, but you will be able to watch all of the sets for the selected venue throughout the entire festival. Access to the Livestream will be available for the fee of \$30. A link will be available on our website soon for you to sign up for this service. Please keep checking back at Pismojazz.com to see how to connect to this We will also be sending e-mails to our regular Jubilee distribution lists with this information.

We are all very excited to be back in Pismo Beach and Grover Beach, hosting the festival of a lifetime after a long, hard year. We think that many of you are anxious to rejoin us. Although things could change in the coming months and affect our plans, we will do our best to provide the entertainment and party atmosphere that has come to be associated with Jazz Jubilee by the Sea. We hope that we can all be together to make this happen.

Paso Robles man lost his home in an RV fire. Then came a life-changing gift

Just a week ago, Billy Tosch thought he'd lost everything when a sudden fire reduced the RV he called home to a blackened frame and ash.

Little did Tosch know, however, his fortunes would completely change in a matter of days, thanks to the kindness of strangers from throughout San Luis Obispo County brought together by social media and a Tribune story.

On Friday, the good will all came together in a touching moment, when Tosch received a replacement RV from a Nipomo resident. The donation of a fully outfitted and working home on wheels brought Tosch to tears. "I think it's the most beautiful thing in the world, I really do," Tosch said. "I thought I lost everything. I'll have this the rest of my life. This is my home."

Tosch's story of loss took a heartwarming turn when he received a gift motor home from **Hugh Robinson** of Nipomo.

On the evening of Feb. 26, Tosch's previous RV, his home of two years, caught fire and burned to rubble before his eyes in a matter of minutes.

The vehicle was parked in the Paso Robles Walmart parking lot when flames sparked in the front seat. Tosch was walking his dog, Sadie, at the time, and he smelled smoke when he returned.

Tosch tried to put out the fire himself, before he was forced to crawl to safety as flames engulfed the vehicle. The Fire Department tried to save the RV, but the fire destroyed the vehicle and nearly everything Tosch owned.

"I had the shirt on my back, literally, just what I had on," he said on Friday. "And I didn't even have time to grab my guitar."

Shortly after the fire, social media united a community of people determined to help Tosch. Elizabeth Denny, drove by the fire that Friday evening and later started a GoFundMe page to help Billy. "I started that, and it just took off like wildfire," Denny said on Friday. The GoFundMe raised \$3,500 in less than 48 hours. Denny, Flint and the those who donated to the GoFundMe were able to collect money and supplies for Tosch, but he still needed a place to live.

Enter **Hugh Robinson** of Nipomo, who had a 1992 RV in storage that he wanted to give to Tosch. After reading The Tribune's story, Robinson reached out to the newspaper, which connected him to Denny and Flint.

After retiring in the early 1990s, Robinson said he and his late wife traveled many miles in the RV, making cross-country drives to visit family. Now in his 90s, Robinson said he likely shouldn't be driving the RV anymore, anyways. "I'm glad Billy will get good use out of it," he said.
