### Our November Show, Nov. 21 Vintage Videos Featuring Viper Six & The Reynolds Brothers!

For this month's show, I have gone back in our video archives and selected two vintage band recordings to showcase for you. Both of these recordings were meaningful to me for different reasons. Both feature bands that are no longer performing together.



#### Viper Six in February 2014

The first recording is of Viper Six from February of 2014. This powerhouse band included Bob Osborne (recently deceased) on tenor saxophone, Bob Brenman on alto sax, Ted Waterhouse on lead guitar. Michael Dias on bass, Jim Stromberg (the Octopus) on drums and Ms Buffy on vocals. The video quality and sound are excellent; and we are reminded of what great musicians live in our area and what a pleasure it was to watch this band perform. It also reminds me of what a great player Bob Osborne was, and a real pleasure to be around. His character and his musicianship are sorely missed.

Viper Six performed in the Vet's Hall twice that I know of and were also the band that played at the BSR BBQ for at least four years. The band stopped performing together around 2017.

Ted Waterhouse, who performed last April on the Gazebo with the great band, Jump Jax, checked in with the members of that band who are still with us today. Here's what he found out:

"As mentioned, the wonderful saxophonist, Bob Osborn passed on October 8th, 2021. He will be sorely missed in the local music community. I (Ted Waterhouse) am currently performing around SLO County with my new quartet the Jump Jax featuring the brilliant Ron saxophones, McCarley on Michael Smothers on Drums and vocals and David Block on bass and vocals, playing jumpswing, rhythm & blues, rockabilly and soul. Drummer Jim Stromberg is currently performing at the Madonna Inn every Friday night and some Saturdays with the Frank Gary Band as well as with the Royal Garden Swing Orchestra and various other groups. Saxophonist Bob Brenman still performs with The Swinging Bridge quartet which has played at the 39 Plus Club in Morro Bay as well as with Val Johnson and Al B. Blue. Bassist Michael Dias is currently performing with Unfinished Business as well as his Rat Pack era trio Three Martini Vocalist Ms Buffy (AKA Sharon Lunch. Doran) is retired from music and had turned her attention to gardening."

Our second video is of the Reynolds Brothers performing with many local guest artists in September of 2011, specifically Katie Cavera, Marc Caparone Jeff Beaumont and the late great Paul Reid. There is also a cameo appearance of a young Molly Reeves.

I have been a fan of the Reynolds Brothers from before I was a member of BSR. When Jeff and I were first dating, we used to go the Breaker's Hotel in Long Beach to catch a set of the Palm Springs Yacht Club, which

featured John Reynolds on guitar, Ralf Reynolds on washboard and percussion and Lee "Westy" Westenhofer on tuba. We saw them many times in Long Beach and Jeff even made an excellent recording of them at the Long Beach Museum of Art. They also appeared at a memorable traditional jazz festival on Catalina Island.

Years later, when our daughter, Cathy, went to her first jazz camp in Sacramento, her instructor that year turned out to be none other than the Palm Springs Yacht Club alumni and tuba player, Westy Westenhofer. At the conclusion of the camp, we presented him with the long-ago recording that Jeff had made in Long Beach when Cathy was just a baby. We also presented John with a copy on the day that this recording was made.

This also features Paul Reid on piano, strutting his stuff. We are reminded again of the great musicians that have graced our halls who are no longer with us.

As for the rest of the musicians that performed that day, most are still around. Jeff Beaumont, Marc Caparone and Katie Cavera just played in the Gazebo last month with the Creole Syncopators. John Reynolds is still performing in the Los Angeles area. Ralf Reynolds has taken up residence in Guatemala.

These are my personal picks for this month. They show our club in full swing, chairs full, Hugh selling raffle tickets, party in the house. I hope that we are able to return to our hall and fill it again without cares or worry. Please enjoy the show. #### October was Great!

#### Technical Report by Rhonda Cardinal

We were a little bit stressed about the October show, which was very high stakes. We worried about the technical portion of it, but there was also the distinct possibility of rain. We did not want to cancel the show and we watched the weather report like hawks for the weeks leading up the event. On the day of the show, it looked like the weather crisis would be averted and that the rain wouldn't start until Sunday night, well after the show. Nevertheless, we had many canopies and umbrellas waiting in the wings, ready to be set up at a moment's notice. We took some measures to protect the electronics when we set up the day before. Many thanks, once again to Fred Felch, who helped us with the set up on Saturday along with Tara Hoffman and Curtis Reinhart, who cleaned our patio top to bottom.

Since this show was starting two hours

earlier than usual, we had to get set up and ready to do a sound and video check by 11:00 a.m. But I had not made it clear to the first band what time to be there and we didn't get everyone on stage until ten minutes till Livestream. We did a very quick sound check and away we went. It took us a few minutes to get everything fine tuned, but the show looked pretty good from the get-go. The live audience was very enthusiastic and made it all worth it.

The Rigney band started showing up an hour before their scheduled start time and they were anxious to get on stage and start playing. We knew it was going to be a hard transition since the Creole Syncopators did not use drums and the Flambeau band did. We had all of the drums back stage and ready to go, but there were still many adjustments to be made. We stopped the Syncopators at 1:50 (they did not take a real break during their performance) to allow Rigney a little more time to set up, but the whole thing took over 30 minutes. Again, the live audience didn't care - we had food and drink in the house available for donation.

When we finally got Rigney going, the look and the sound was good. There were no big hiccups and overall it was an excellent production. I encourage everyone who couldn't be there in person to check it out.

Thanks to Tara Hoffman and Sharon Marshall for keeping our glasses full.

This was Tom Rigney and Flambeau's first time to play in the Cardinal's backyard. Our

bodies were shaking and our feet tapping and the moment they started playing, the party was swing'n. They were, "Drivin' That Thing." Then it was time for a Cajun tune, Le Bal a Chataigner." I dare you to say it twice. It was getting cooler in the backyard, but we had



"Summertime" to warm our souls. Then it was time for something Irish, so we dancers did a jig to "Guinness and Gumbo". I saw line dancing going on too, "Call Me the Breeze".
