Tom Rigney and Flambeau

Tom Rigney is one of the premier Roots Music fiddle players on the planet. His band, Tom Rigney and Flambeau, specializes in blazing Cajun two-steps, low-down Blues, funky New Orleans grooves, Boogie Woogie piano, and heartbreakingly beautiful ballads and waltzes. Much of the repertoire is composed by Rigney, but they mix in a few from the Cajun/New Orleans songbook. Along the way you may pick up a trace of Rigney's Irish roots, or echoes of Eastern Europe--it just makes the musical gumbo that much tastier.

Flambeau showcases Rigney's virtuoso fiddling, his charismatic presence, and his range and originality as a composer. He and Flambeau have forged a unique sound that blends American Roots styles into something original and HOT-irresistible grooves mixing with deep musicality and spectacular soloing. Rigney's pulls showmanship high-energy audience into his performances and makes them feel they are a part of the music and the show.

The Creole Syncopators

The Creole Syncopators are celebrating their 36th year as one of the West Coast's most authentic Traditional Jazz bands. They play Hot Jazz and Blues from the 1920's as well as some spirited music from Chicago's South Side and early New Orleans. The band specializes in the less often heard tunes originally performed by artists such as King Oliver, Jelly Roll Morton, Louis Armstrong, Ma Rainey, Bessie Smith, and Kid Ory, among others. Their music sounds just as alive and fresh today as it did during the Great Depression. Band members include Valerie Johnson on Vocals, Robbie Rhodes on Piano, Al Ingram on Banjo and guitar, Marc Caparone on Cornet, Dave

Caparone on Trombone, Todd Temanson on Banjo, Katie Cavera on Bass, Jeff Beaumont (leader) on Reeds, and Shirley Beaumont on Washboard. This long-time line-up includes four of their original members, and it's been over a decade since any new members were added. Many of these musicians are recognized and well known throughout the West Coast for their many contributions to the local and international music scene.

We solicited and subsequently hired the Creole Syncopators and Tom Rigney and Flambeau to be our back yard performers. I hope that a lot of you will come out and see it

in person. I am looking into getting some covers for the back yard in case of rain. One of my neighbors runs a party rental store and I will be talking to him. We will have food available for a donation provided by Living Life catering company. Beer and wine will also be available for a donation. We are planning to set up the dance floor.

Our schedule will be a little different. We will run from noon to 4:00 p.m. The Syncopators will do the first two sets, from noon until 2:00 p.m., including a break. The Flambeau Band will play from 2:00 to 4:00, including a break.

We also have another treat for both locals and out-of-towners. The Jazz Alley Review will perform at the Vespera on Ocean on Saturday, October 23rd, from 3:30 to 5:30. The lawn area at Vespera is inspiring, with a beautiful view of the ocean and an outdoor bar. There is also an excellent restaurant on site. We encourage all of you to take advantage of this great opportunity to visit one of the premier boutique hotels on the Central Coast. The address is 147 Stimson Avenue on Pismo Beach. It is next to the Pier. Parking is available for a fee in the lot next to the hotel and on surrounding streets and there is also valet parking at the hotel (a hotel meal gets you two hours of free parking). If you park at the Addie Street parking lot, you can walk from there, and that lot is still free.

Jazz Alley Review playing at Vespera on Ocean Saturday, October 23rd

As mentioned above, the Jazz Alley Review will perform at Vespera on Ocean from 3:30 to 5:30 on Saturday, October 23rd. This is a reprise of a performance they gave in 2018 at the conclusion of that year's Jazz Jubilee by the Sea. At that time, they played right after the festival ended. The Vespera had barely opened. Curtis Reinhart stepped onto the Addie Street stage at the conclusion of the last set and encouraged everyone to walk over to Vespera to see this additional show. A lot of people took him up on it and the band was very well received. We gave Vespera their choice of bands for that Saturday and they chose Jazz Alley Review once again.



The Jazz Alley Review:

Their repertoire ranges from classic bebop to new contemporary compositions in styles from swing to Latino funk and more. From ballads to blues, their tempos go from slow to hot. They can accommodate a variety of preferences from dancing to easy listening to in the groove, handclapping tunes. The ensemble comprises three horns (trumpet, sax and trombone) and rhythm section (piano, bass and drums) -- large enough for interesting musical arrangements but small enough not to overpower more intimate settings. The sextet's members are all not only accomplished ensemble players but also excellent soloists.

The musicians are: Lee Irwin - Saxophone/Leader, Joe Montgomery - Trumpet, Kent Anderson -Bass Trumpet, Becky McClaflin - Piano, Travis Harms - Bass and Rob Price - Drums.
