## September 26<sup>th</sup> Show 1:50 PM The Pub Crawlers featuring Bonnie Otto

Sacramento has been the home for traditional jazz on the west coast since the 1970's. The Sacramento Jazz Jubilee was the largest traditional jazz festival in the world for the last quarter of the 20th century, celebrating the west coast jazz styles championed by musicians like Lu Watters and Turk Murphy. It has been the model for dozens of festivals up and down the western states to this day.

The Pub Crawlers is made up of Sacramento-area musicians steeped in this history. Its musicians have played together in various bands featured at these festivals, including, among others, Sister Swing, The Fulton Street Jazz Band, Stan Mark and His River City Stomperz, and The Wooden Nickel Jass Band, the latter being one of the most popular traditional bands of the 1990's.

Older and wiser, this is not your straw-hatred-striped-vest-pizza-parlor band. This group adheres to much of the tradition of the great music from the 20s and 30s, but with an infectious power and energy that has made these musicians, individually and collectively, among the most popular among fans and musicians all over the country.

Dave Johnson (trumpet, vocals) is a 30year veteran of classic jazz, and his talents are well known and respected in the Northern California musical community. He is one of the most popular musicians in the Sacramento area, and is a regular side man in too many local bands to count. He is equally adept in all musical styles, and plays with a power and ferocity that is palpable.

Otis Mourning (reeds) has been playing traditional jazz since his teens, and is considered one of the premier clarinetists in the country. He is also much sought-after as a saxophonist in the Sacramento area, and is the first call in bands of all kinds and stripes. His is a brilliant creative mind, and he is famous for keeping the rest of the band on its toes, often pulling it into unexpected directions mid-performance.

Bob Williams (trombone, vocals) is also very much in demand in northern California. He is equally comfortable with many musical styles, including classical, rock, and big band jazz, but he especially loves playing tailgate trombone in the styles of Turk Murphy, Jack Teagarden, and Kid Ory. He rounds out a front line widely considered one of the best on the traditional jazz scene.

Bonnie Otto (piano) has played in the Sacramento area for many years, and is well-regarded as a musician and arranger for a number of local bands. Her stride-style playing is highly energetic, and she is easily the most fun to watch. She generally directs traffic in the rhythm section, and does her best to keep the front line out of trouble. She is currently living in Casa Grande, AZ.

Alan Parks (bass and tuba) hails from Napa, and has a long career as a musician and educator in Northern California. He plays bass and tuba in a number of groups up and down the state, including many of his own. His groups are creative and interesting, and Alan fits comfortably in bands of all kinds, covering a number of musical styles.

Rick Canfield has been the drummer for the Blue Street Jazz Band since 1986. He taught instrumental music in Fresno for 32 years. Rick is currently living in Seaside, CA and can be found around the Monterey Bay area playing drums, guitar, and Irish fiddle.

Rick says, "I've been a huge fan of Bob Williams and the gang since sharing stages with Wooden Nickel back in the early nineties. It is a great honor to play with them!"

The Pub Crawlers is a band of friends who play music they love. You can't help but be drawn in by the enthusiasm and talent of this group, and the fun they are having.

#### Jubilee Corner: 2021 Cancelled

Jazz Jubilee by the Sea



With deep regret we have canceled the 2021 Jazz Jubilee by the Sea. The rapidly changing regulatory environment surrounding the recent increase in COVID-19 cases is too overwhelming to ignore. We are concerned that we will not be able to execute the plans we are currently making.

Starting September 20th, all indoor "Mega Events" in California of more than 1000 people would be required to verify vaccination status or negative test status, and the San Luis Obispo County Health Department considers ours to be one. Also, as of September 1st, wearing masks indoors is required in San Luis Obispo County. We considered other options before cancelling, but it is simply too late in the planning cycle to adequately pull together a complete transformation of the Jubilee.

Planning for this festival started in March as an indoor, safe celebration. In June, this looked very possible; but over time we have become less confident. Although many other events in the area are moving forward, our all-volunteer run festival needs to be cancelled.

Putting on a festival is difficult under the best of circumstances, but in the end, we are all there to have fun. It is hard to imagine that this event will be fun when we are required to take measures to mitigate a very serious illness. The specter of this illness would be hanging over us throughout the event. We are very sorry to take this route and understand that this will seriously disappoint our fans. Everyone who bought badges or donated will receive a refund.

We hope to see everyone safely and joyfully in 2022.

## No Veteran's Hall Yet for BSR Sunday Sessions

The City of Pismo Beach has informed us that we will not be able to return to the Vet's Hall in September and maybe not until December. We believe this is in response to the recent uptick in Covid cases. We will remain in the Cardinal back yard until further notice. We will continue to Livestream the show. We apologize for the inconvenience, but we enjoy hosting in our back yard and are happy for the opportunity to do it a few more times!


