# Our May 29th Show: Kathryn Loomis & Co. and the Mady Frei Group!

Featured Band: Kathryn Loomis & Co.

California-native Kathryn Loomis is an accomplished jazz vocalist whose pure, soft, and warm voice matches her elegant singing style.



Whether performing a melancholy torch song or a cheerful swing tune, Loomis's classic approach and experience with the Great American Songbook makes her performances as timeless as the songs she sings.

Her specialty is singing with jazz combos and big bands, including her combo Kathryn Loomis & Company. In addition to performing, Loomis is currently pursuing recording, virtual collaboration, and songwriting.

Rapidly gaining the attention of the Central Coast, Loomis is currently a female vocalist with Starlight Dreamband and The Friendly Neighborhood Big Band. She has also sung with ensembles such as the Cal Poly University Big Band and Jazz Ensemble; the Cuesta College Jazz Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Jazz Combos, and Cuesta Voce; Central City Swing, and the Allan Hancock College Jazz Band.

Loomis studied music at Cuesta College and received her Bachelor of Arts in Music at California Polytechnic State University, San Luis Obispo. Studying a range of art music, musical theatre, and jazz standards, her vocal instructors have included Amy Goymerac, Jacalyn Kreitzer, Chad Ruyle, and Deanna Delore.

Inspired by musical legends, like Ella Fitzgerald, Kathryn Loomis endeavors to tell a story with each song she sings. Kathryn conveys the nuanced emotions of vintage love

songs with her natural stage presence and seemingly effortless musical intuition.

Kathryn's supporting musical ensemble is comprised of several top notch, local professionals who have graced the BSR and Jazz Jubilee stages on numerous occasions: Darrell Voss on drums, Ron McCarley on saxophones, Becky McClaflin on piano and Travis Harms on bass.

Percussionist and Educator Darrell Voss has been active as a professional for over 30 years. He has been teaching at Cuesta College since 2000 and is a key member of the Jazz Faculty and Applied Music Program. He has performed or recorded with hundreds of musicians. He is Delighted to be performing with Kathryn Loomis in 2022.

Rebecca McClaflin is a freelance pianist who performs with a number of groups across the central coast, including the Starlight Dream Band, Riptide Bid Band, Lompoc Pops, San Luis Obispo Symphony, Opera San Luis Obispo Grand Orchestra and numerous small jazz ensembles.

For 17 years Ron McCarley has been the Director of Jazz Studies at Cuesta College where he leads one of the best combo programs at a Community College in the US and an award-winning big band. He has served as a judge and presenter at many festivals and conferences and is an accomplished saxophonist and reed doubler performing and recently recorded as the leader of the jazz CD, "Speak". He and his wife Laura live in Morro Bay with their four children

Travis Harms grew up in Morro Bay and has been playing bass for 26 years. He studied music at Cuesta College and has learned from many of the best musicians on the Central Coast. He currently plays with the Starlight Dreamband, The Jazz Alley Review, and The Royal Garden Swing Orchestra.

The Mady Frei Group is comprised of talented students playing great jazz and dance music, and all are participating in the Cal Poly Jazz Studies Program directed by Arthur White. Mady Frei, the

group's leader, is a dynamic performer who has recorded with Randy Brecker, Ada Rovatti, and Robin Eubanks as a member of the Cal Poly Vocal Jazz Ensemble. Mady was recently awarded an Outstanding Performance citation from the 45<sup>th</sup> annual DOWNBEAT Student Music Awards.

#### Help Support Livestream:

We know that many of you are tuning into the Livestreams, either while it is live or catching it later. There is a very talented team making this Livestream happen every month. Simon Mercado is running the camera and all of the computer and technical aspects including the links to the various platforms that we stream on. Jeff Cardinal and Jim Borland are feeding him the sound directly from the Hall mixer. We also have a computer and speakers set up in the back classroom to monitor the stream while it is happening.

Simon brings in all of the computer equipment and a hotspot, links up the Vet's Hall WiFi and is "at work" from the time he arrives at 10:00 a.m. until he takes it all down and leaves at around 4:30. If there are any problems with the stream, we look to Simon to fix it. He is the man behind the production.

We started Livestreaming during Covid, when all of the shows were taking place in the Cardinal back yard. During that two years, we developed quite a following. When we moved back to the Vet's Hall, we considered dropping this practice, since people can now attend in person at our regular venue if they choose. But we found that many of our fans are still holding back from indoor events and that we have new fans scattered throughout the country and the world.

So we are going to continue to Livestream for the foreseeable future. But this costs the BSR money, as does the return to the Vet's hall. In the two and a half years since we started, Simon's experience and business has grown, and we are competing with other customers for his time.

We do not charge very much for membership or entrance to the hall, considering the quality of the shows that we are producing. We depend heavily on donations and grants to help make our budget every year. Jubilee by the Sea is not a big source of funding anymore. We are lucky to break even. ## In the Wings

We have some great shows coming up for you in June and July.

In June we will feature Western Swing Band Dave Stuckey and the Hoot Owls.

When musicians from Texas, Oklahoma and

California got bit by the jazz bug in the 1930's - they swung the beat with the folk instruments they had on hand - and a whole new infectious, swinging genre was born --they called it Western Swing!

This red-hot aggregation features Dave Stuckey (rhythm guitar and vocals), Marc Caparone (trumpet), Josh Collozo (drums), Mikiya Matsuda (steel guitar), Katie Cavera on the doghouse bass and the inimitable Carl Sonny Leyland on piano. The result is swingin', singin', dancin' fun!" We do not have an opening band booked yet.

In July, we will bring back the *new* Night Blooming Jazzmen! From the NBJ website: "Chet Jaeger's family has decided that the band should continue to perform, spreading our usual excitement while also paying tribute to Chet's legacy to the jazz community. Les Deutsch is moving from the piano chair to play cornet and lead the NBJ. Trumpet is actually Les' first instrument - and it is a whole lot easier to lead a band from the cornet position. Check out this interesting sample of Les' cornet playing (in fact, he plays all the parts on this video!) Andrew Barrett will take the piano chair. The remainder of the NBJ remains intact. The Night Blooming Jazzmen are a traditional, or Dixieland band, formed in October 1975 to represent the Society for the Preservation of Dixieland Jazz at the third Sacramento Jubilee. There were very few jazz bands in existence then – not enough to put on a festival. The NBJ was started as an ad-hoc "pickup band." It was not expected to survive - but the NBJ were so well-received and had so much fun that they stuck together. Since then, they have played thousands of concerts, church services, funerals, house parties, grand openings, jazz clubs, wedding receptions, dances, etc .. AND several dozen cruises and land trips to China, Japan, Australia, New Zealand, Alaska, Hawaii, the Caribbean, the Panama Canal, the Amazon, the Mediterranean, and many other parts of Europe."

Our opening band will be the Big Sirs of Swing. "The Big Sirs of Swing" is a Gypsy Jazz Quartet based on the Central Coast of California. They play the music stylings of Django Reinhardt and Stephane Grappelli, who originated the Gypsy Jazz genre in France in the 1930s. Fun and Danceable music!

We are very excited about the next two shows and we look forward to ever increasing attendance in the hall.

In April, we attended the Three Rivers Jazzaffair festival at the base of Sequoia National Park. This is the first time this festival has been held since 2019. We took our motor home up there and camped in the Lion's Roping Arena, along with some of our close friends from the Basin Street Regulars.

The weather was great; pretty warm in the daytime and chilly at night. We were allowed to have a little campfire in the arena in a firepit that we brought. Every morning, we took turns on breakfast duty. The rest of our meals were eaten at the venues or at the Gateway restaurant. There was also camping happy hour in the evenings.

All of the usual bands were there from California including Sierra Seven, Tom Rigney and Flambeau, Dave Bennet, Gator Nation, Gino and the Lone Gunmen, Reedley River Rats, Carl Sonny Leyland, and a few others. There were a few out-of-state bands including the Holland-Coots Jazz Quintet (some locals in that) and Blue Street (mostly locals). Bob Draga was brought in from Florida and joined with other California musicians to form a quartet.

There were three venues with buses running the circuit on the hour. There were some special feature sets and combos. It was not hard to see at least one set of all of the bands in one day.

The Gateway restaurant hosted a band from the festival every evening from 8:00 to 10:00. We went on Saturday night and were treated to a very funky Gator Nation set. Everyone on the patio was dancing by the end of the night.

Jazzaffair is a great festival to hang out at. You can watch the show at the arena from your campsite if you don't want to go to the stage area. The Three Rivers Lions Club host the bar and give away free coffee every morning. There is a raffle with some great prizes. Parasols are available for those that want to parade.

I like it because you can be outdoors or indoors. It is very casual. I know they are going through some management changes next year and I hope they can continue. But I also know how it is. All we can do is be grateful for the fun we've had and hope that there's more in the future.

#### Hold Harmless Agreement

The Basin Street Regulars incorporated last year, and as a result of that, we had to review and renew all of our legal paperwork, including our insurance. This, on top of the pandemic, caused our insurance carrier to require that we present a Hold Harmless clause to all of our attendees, band members and volunteers. This has become another manifestation of the "new normal" and is ubiquitous for anyone who travels or attends other live events.

We have struggled with the prospect of getting all of our members to sign this on an annual basis, a never-ending task given the various ways that people renew their membership. We will therefore incorporate this clause as a de-facto condition of membership. The Hold Harmless clause is below:

Basin Street Regulars Hold Harmless

The person or band members voluntarily waive any and all claims and potential claims against BSR, its officers, employees and volunteers for any injuries whether physical, financial or mental. This includes any injury relating to COVID or any other communicable disease, or illness, or that arises from or relates in any way to, however caused, the risk of exposure or actual or alleged exposures to a bacteria, virus or other pathogens capable of causing COVID or any other communicable disease or illness, in each case whether the actual or alleged circumstances giving rise to any claim or potential claim occur before, during or after the event.

## Jubilee Corner





We are a "Go" For Martin Luther King weekend in 2023. We have secured the Pismo Beach Veteran's Memorial Building for that weekend and also have contracted for the Grover Beach Community Center. Curtis Reinhardt worked hard to make these arrangements. We are also working to secure the St. Paul's Hall directly across the parking lot from the Vet's Hall. This venue holds up to 200 people and will give us additional parking spaces behind the building. We have not used it since I have been Festival Director, but it looks very promising and will give our attendees two venues within walking distance of each other. We are working on some additional venues and will have more details in the coming months.

Moving our event to January will make us the first jazz festival of the year. There are fewer events in the January through May time period; with only about one festival per month. We will also be the first one to hire some of the very popular out-of-state bands. Other festivals have been holding back due to the pandemic and mostly employing California bands.

January can be a tricky month due to the possibility of rain and the shorter days. To mitigate this problem, and to resolve some of the logistics issues with the City, we are going to eliminate the Addie Street tent. Some fans will be disappointed with this change, but it will reduce our venue costs and keep everyone warm and dry in this variable time of year. It will also allow us to have more sets of music, as we have had to shut this venue down early the last few years as our fans do not want to stay there when it is dark and cold. We are investigating possible indoor venues with ocean views.

Since this is Martin Luther King weekend, we will offer some band selections that are different for our festival. We are actively seeking bands that will represent the holiday.

Some of our favorite bands have already been contacted and agreed to participate that weekend. These include Cornet Chop Suey, Professor Cunningham and His Old School, the Midiri Brothers, Jeff Barnhart and Ivory and Gold

A highly anticipated new band for our festival will be the Holland/Coots Swingin West band from Nashville, Tennessee. Our Thursday night show will also be new, featuring the widely acclaimed trio, Groovus (Holland, Coots and Steven Pikal) with special guest Adrian Cunningham. You do not want to miss the only performance of this musical assemblage at our festival.

We will honor the ticket prices that we established in 2020; pre-Jubilee, early bird \$115 through September 15th, \$120 through October 15<sup>th</sup> and 3-day \$130 starting October 16<sup>th</sup> and at the door. Thursday night tickets \$25. Single day badges are available, \$60 for Friday, \$80 for Saturday and \$30 for Sunday. Half price badges will be available on Friday and Saturday starting at 5:00 p.m. We will continue our tradition of \$30 3-day badges for those aged 30 and under- a remarkable value.

In addition to our live in-person shows, we will also offer the opportunity to watch a Livestream of the performances from one of the venues for those that cannot attend in person. The venue location of the Livestream has not yet been determined, but you will be able to watch all of the sets for the selected venue throughout the entire festival.

We are all very excited to be back in Pismo Beach and Grover Beach hosting the festival of a lifetime after a few hard years. We know that many of you are anxious to rejoin us. Although things could change in the coming months and affect our plans, we fully expect to provide the entertainment and party atmosphere that has come to be associated with Jazz Jubilee by the Sea.


