

The Creole Syncopators are celebrating their 39th year as one of the West Coast's most authentic Traditional Jazz bands. Band members include Valerie Johnson on Vocals, Carl Sonny Leyland on Piano, Al Ingram on Banjo and guitar, Marc Caparone on Cornet, Dave Caparone on Trombone, Todd Temanson on Banjo, Katie Cavera on Bass, Jeff Beaumont (leader) on Reeds, and Shirley Beaumont on Washboard. This long-time line-up includes four of their original members, and it's been over a decade since any new members were added. Many of these musicians are recognized and well known throughout the West Coast for their many contributions to the local and international music scene.

The OASIS Ukulele Orchestra The orchestra gathers each week on Wednesdays from 1-3 p.m. at the OASIS Center in Old Town Orcutt (420 Soares Ave.). The Orchestra was formed in November of

2003 by Ben Tromp. Ben visited a ukulele band in Ventura, CA and was so excited that he wanted to start a band in Orcutt. Signups and practice started soon after and the rest is history. The band was originally named the ÓASIS Play and Sing Along Society. Their first performance was a potluck dinner at the OASIS Senior Center on May 10, 2004. The group had little cards with the songs printed on them and passed them out to the audience to sing along. The band has since shortened its name to The OASIS Ukulele Orchestra with an average of 30 people participating weekly. They have their own printed and electronic music book that is added to regularly. Free beginner and intermediate lessons are offered at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesdays before the orchestra practices. Many students from these classes have joined the OASIS Orchestra. Past leaders include Rev Reynante and our own Tom Dutart. The band is currently mostly led by BSR member Diane Brand with help from many other band members.

his 100th birthday. Lisa Doran, aka Mz Buffy, joined the Jump Jax to help recreate the sound of Viper Six. This was by special request of Bern and the band really delivered. Even though it has been at least 10 years since we last saw Viper Six on our stage, Mz Buffy didn't miss a beat. She looked and sounded as good as she ever did. The band was great too, performing a mix of their Jump Jax repertoire and vintage Viper Six tunes.



At the break, we presented Bern with some very special awards. One of the awards to Bern was the

President's Lifetime Volunteer Service Award. The President's Volunteer Service Award is available to anyone who puts in at least 100 hours of Volunteer Service. Awards can be made for 100-249, 249-499, 500+ and 4000+ total hours. A Certifying Organization must vouch for the number of hours that the candidate has worked. The Basin Street Regulars is a qualified certifying organization. We applied for this designation about 5 years ago when we nominated Hugh Robinson for this same award. Both Hugh and Bern were eligible for the Lifetime Achievement Award, equaling 4000+ hours of volunteer service. Any one of our regular volunteers are eligible for some level of this award. The Basin Street Regulars can nominate people and request the awards. The certification must be renewed periodically, ours is due in 2024. If you think a BSR member should receive the award, please let me know and we can submit the application. Tom Rigney and Flambeau



Our featured band in September is Tom Rigney and Flambeau! Tom Rigney is one of the premier American Roots Music fiddle players on the planet. His band produces two-steps, lowdown Blues, funky New Orleans grooves, Boogie Woogie piano, and heartbreakingly beautiful ballads and waltzes.

Much of the repertoire is composed by Rigney, but they mix in some classics from the Cajun/New Orleans songbook. Along the way you may pick up a trace of Rigney's Irish roots, or echoes of folk music styles–it just makes the musical gumbo that much tastier. Flambeau showcases Rigney's fiery, virtuoso fiddling, his charismatic stage presence, and his range and originality as a composer. He and Flambeau have forged a unique sound that blends American Roots styles into something original and HOT-mixing irresistible grooves with deep musicality and spectacular soloing. Rigney's high-energy showmanship pulls the audience into his performances and makes them feel they are a part of the music and the show.

For this particular show, Tim Haggarty, of Gator Nation, will be filling in for Sam Rocha on bass. Sam is unavailable that day. We know Tim will be great, Gator Nation and Flambeau have done quite a few combo sets this last year and are familiar with each other's repertoire.

Opening Band: Tres Whiskeys & a Special Guest

Tres Whiskeys are a fun-loving Central Coast trio covering jazz, blues, and Latin favorites. The members are Chris Roullard on guitar, Terry Handy on bass, and Maggie Przybylski on vocals. David Johns often joins them with a tasty 1930's - style trumpet. Whether you want jazzy blues, bluesy jazz, or Latin spice, they are a great addition to any local

gathering.


