Featured Band: Kathryn Loomis & Co.

California-native Kathryn Loomis is an accomplished jazz vocalist whose pure, soft, and warm voice matches her elegant singing style. Whether performing a melancholy torch song or a cheerful swing tune, Loomis's classic approach and experience with the Great American Songbook



makes her performances as timeless as the songs she sings.

Her specialty is singing with jazz combos and big bands, including her combo Kathryn Loomis & Company. In addition to performing, Loomis is currently pursuing virtual collaboration, recording, and songwriting.

Rapidly gaining the attention of the Central Coast, Loomis is currently a female vocalist with Starlight Dreamband and The Friendly Neighborhood Big Band. She has also sung with ensembles such as the Cal Poly University Big Band and Jazz Ensemble; the Cuesta College Jazz Orchestra, Jazz Ensemble, Jazz Combos, and Cuesta Voce; Central City Swing, and the Allan Hancock College Jazz Band.

Opening Act: SLOHS Honors Jazz Band

Our May opening band is the SLOHS Honors Jazz Band. This will be the first time this 17-piece band has played for us. The San Luis Obispo High School Band Program is a comprehensive music program and is SLO County's largest band program. Each of their performing ensembles and related groups has received superior ratings at



festivals and competitions in all areas of band performance. Their reputation for quality music performances is second only to the reputation enjoyed for the outstanding quality of young adults who pass through our ensemble. The SLOHS Honors Jazz Band is an audition only group that features the top players in the school. This group goes to several festivals and clinics throughout the year, and performs for the school, and throughout the community.

The Dave Bennet quartet was an unexpected pleasure. Dave was dressed up in a suit jacket and turtleneck and played jazz standards, accompanied by his excellent piano and bass players and his long-time drummer. This is a side of Dave that I haven't seen before, and I really

enjoyed it.

At the conclusion of our sets, the Shorbs retrieved us from the Retreat and we returned to the Lions arena to catch the last sets of the day; Rigney and the Sierra Stompers. Rigney was excellent as always. His last set of the weekend really delivered.

This latest incarnation of the Sierra band features some new musicians not seen before in this group- Brian Holland and Katie Cavera. They were welcome additions, and under the direction of Marc Caparone, I think they will be performing in this configuration for many years to come.

At the conclusion of the event, the volunteers were treated to a little party hosted by our good friends from Three Rivers, Robin and Sylvia. The

party featured a taco truck, local ice cream and many different kinds of drinks. But we had to be conservative because we needed to get home that night. The Wailers bring their passion and energy to the style, making it as fresh today as it was when it was the newest, hottest dance music 100 years ago! This eclectic crew really entertains with a whole lot of jazz, a pinch of blues, and a bayou full of New Orleans swagger. They have been influenced by a cocktail of artists, past and present, as well as Traditional New Orleans Jazz, Classic Blues, Country Blues and Big Band sounds. April Show


