Their upbeat jazz tunes attracted a big crowd and we can't wait to have them back". They have played for Daou Winery, The Arroyo Grande Strawberry Festival, The Vespera Resort on Pismo Beach as an off site band for the Pismo Jazz Jubilee, The Avila Beach Yacht Club, The Jazz Vespers in San Luis Obispo, the Shell Beach Christmas Parade and private parties throughout the Central Coast. Their book of music consists of most styles of jazz from traditional to hard bop, jazz/rock and fusion. The band members bring diverse professional backgrounds. Lee Irwin, the leader and Saxophonist, came from 30 years in the Cable TV and computer science industry. Dr. Rob Price, drummer extraordinaire, is a local neurologist. Craig Updegrove, keyboardist, is retired from clinical psychology. Craig is also president of the



San Luis Obispo Jazz Federation. Joe Montgomery, Mr. Trumpet, is a retired Motion Picture Cameraman. He was on an assignment for 5 years with the National Geographic Explorer series. If you want to hear fascinating stories, just talk to Joe. Bruce "Scotty" Scott is a local realtor with a long background in music. If you remember Les Brown, Scotty was a trombonist for Les Brown and His Band of Renown, Travis Harms, legionary Bassist, is a videographer. Travis travels up and down the state making sure your local city council meetings are video broadcasted. Rich Severson, guitarist, is the newest member of the band, is originally from the L.A. and has been playing and teaching guitar for over 50 years.



Prez Says
by Rhonda Cardinal In my mind, I think that our attendance at the monthly Sunday sessions has dropped as a result of the Covid years. When I look back on the data, however, I find that even before COVID, monthly attendance was similar to what we have now-somewhere between 100 and 130 people every month. However, in the "old days," attendance could really jump if we had a band that was very popular, such as Blue Street or Night Blooming Jazzmen. We might get as many as 200 people or more. This resulted in higher annual averages; 178 in 2015, 138 in 2016, 148 in 2017, 168 in 2018 and 120 in 2019. From March of 2020 through November of 2021, we had backyard shows. We did not have to pay to rent a hall those months and our headcounts were unofficial, since we were not really supposed to be gathering. Our attendance was mostly on-line, and the donations on-line and in the house were pretty generous. So, we did well financially for those two years.

We came back to the Vet's Hall in Dec. of 2021. In 2022, our annual average was 122 people and so far 2023 we are at 122 people. This isn't too bad. Our headcount has been fairly consistent at the Vet's Hall since 2019.

What has not been consistent is our costs, which have increased dramatically since the COVID shutdown, including the costs to rent the hall, insurance and accounting services. The conditions and requirements for renting the hall have also greatly expanded, due in no small part to the recent pandemic. This is true for every city facility that we have looked at lately.

This is one of the reasons we have been taking our shows "on the road" occasionally to check out possible alternate venues and save money on the halls. November is an excellent month for this, as attendance is traditionally very low, usually around 100. December used to be a slow month until we started putting on our Holiday Party. Now it is one the most popular events of the year.

Please bear with us as we move our shows around to save on hall rental and embed ourselves in the Community. We are always looking for ways to improve our membership and bottom line. You can help by bringing your friends to our shows, promoting our club and volunteering to be on our Board next year.

Elections are slated to be held at the December Sunday session, per our by-laws. New or returning board members and officers will assume their new positions starting in February of 2024.

Officer positions that are now open include President, Vice President, Secretary and Treasurer. Here are the duties of these Officers, as stated

in the BSR By-Laws:

Section 4. The President The President shall preside over all membership and Board meetings and be present at all musical and social events, when

possible. The President shall be the executive officer of the Corporation and have the duty to carry out the policies and decisions of the membership.

Section 5. Vice-President The Vice-President shall, in the absence of the President, serve in that capacity and shall perform duties as may be assigned by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. Treasurer The Treasurer shall keep accurate and complete records of the funds and accounts of the Society. The Treasurer shall make only such disbursements from the funds of the Society as are authorized by the Board of Directors. The Treasurer shall furnish the local, State and Federal governments with the proper tax records at the appropriate times. The Treasurer shall render monthly financial statements to the Board of Directors and, within one week of the conclusion of the annual election, shall present the financial records of the Society to the new Board of Directors for audit. *Note: This is a really critical* position and Linda Dutart has been doing it for a long time. Anyone who takes this position will have Linda Dutart to guide them until they are ready to work independently. If you are interested or know someone who might be interested, please consider this important position.

Section 7. Secretary The Secretary shall keep and preserve all records, the Constitution and By-laws, and the minutes of business meetings, and shall determine the number of voting members present to establish a quorum, and may receive and answer all correspondence pertaining to the Society, wherever applicable.

We really need some new members to join our ranks and keep this organization in tip top shape. We have a lot of resources at our disposal and we need to wisely manage them.
