Your Board has been very busy these last few months procuring top-notch musical entertainment for you. We have been teaming up with our local dance organizations and between us have worked to find bands that are sought after by both the dance community and the trad jazz community. Our April band is a perfect example of this collaboration. Together we are able to bring you the Alpha Rhythm Kings from San Francisco. This is a band that we have wanted to hire for many years, but they were just out of reach. In order to play for us, they wanted multiple gigs and to have hotel rooms. We are able to do that this year by partnering with the Cal Poly Swing Dance Club. They are bringing them to a dance event on Saturday and we will have them performing for us the next day on Sunday. We are splitting the cost of their hotel rooms. This show will take place on April 28th at the Pismo Beach Veteran's Hall.

In **May**, we will feature a singer and musician that we lasted hosted during the backyard shows in May of 2020; **Marci Jean Fabrini**. At that time she was performing with the Belmont Kings and she really knocked our socks off. Marci Jean was on hiatus for a few years and dabbled in bluegrass and church performances. But recently, she decided to return to her blues roots. She performed once this year with the Belmont Kings, which has now

disbanded. Undeterred, she sought out another group of musicians and is now leading Marci Jean and the Fever. This excellent group features well-known local blues guitarist and vocalist James Scoolis and also national recording artist Wes Star on drums. The band is rounded out by Wil Anderson on bass and Brad Hackleman on saxophone. This show takes place on May 26th over Memorial Day weekend. This show will be at the Pismo Beach Vets Hall. If you want a sneak preview, catch Marci Jean and the Fever at the Siren in Morro Bay on March 21st where she will be joined by special guest Carl Sonny Leyland.

In June, our guests will be Ginger Pauley and Hoosier Daddy. We were introduced Ginger Pauley in 2019 when she sang a few songs during our jam session. She is very good friends with our Australian member and trombonist, Paul Ingle. We received an inquiry from Ginger last year and we looked at her videos and decided to hire her. Paul Ingle will be her special guest. We are very excited about this show, this is a new band to all of us. This event will take place on lune 30th in the Pismo Beach Veteran's Hall.

In **July**, we are taking advantage of a rare opportunity to host the Midiri Brothers for our monthly event. The Midiris are playing at the Norris Center in Palos Verdes on Sunday, July 21st. They asked us if we would like them to do a show for us the day before or the day after their Sunday show. We considered it and have decided to move our monthly event to Saturday, July 20th. We will keep the same afternoon hours as our regular events and it will take place at the Pismo Beach Veteran's Hall. We are very excited to be bringing this band to the Central Coast. The tickets at the Norris Center are \$88 for the music only and \$133 for the music plus dinner. Our tickets will be more reasonable, price TBD. We will be paying part of their travel expenses, so we will need to charge more than our normal door admission to recoup our cost. We will provide more details when we have them.

Finally (for now), in **August**, we will be showcasing Dave Stuckey and the Hot House Gang. This band also appeared in April 2021

They will be the feature band at our Summer BBQ at the Cardinal House. They are another dance favorite and will include some of the local favorite musicians. Dave Stuckey and the Hoot Owls, a Western Swing band, last appeared at the Vet's Hall in June of 2022. Dave was ill for that performance and the band was led by Carl Sonny Leyland.

In the Wings-Our April Show

Our April show will be held at the Pismo Beach Veteran's Hall. We will have our normal jam session starting at 11:00. Tevis Ranger Jazz Ensemble members may be joining us.

Opening Band: Tevis Ranger Jazz Ensemble

The Tevis Ranger Jazz Ensemble from Bakersfield, California is a made up of a select group of 7th and 8th grade musicians from Tevis Junior High, under the direction of BSR member Kelly Willey, The band has proudly represented their school and district at many events including the Bakersfield Jazz Workshop, The Dos Palos Jazz Festival, Bakersfield College Jazz Day and various local service clubs. They are thrilled to return to the Basin Street Regulars Sunday Session Calendar. This year they were overjoyed when Mrs. Willey was honored with the Kern County Music Educators Jazz Educator Award, honoring excellence in Jazz Education and Performance.

The Tevis Rangers Jazz Ensemble made their debut at BSR as an intermission band in May 2015. This was the first time a junior high school band had ever appeared at a BSR event. The students were all in white shirts and vests, and they looked and performed professionally. The band put on an amazing show and the response from the crowd was overwhelming. Only two years after their first Pismo performance, the band was invited to join the line up of the Pismo Jubilee By The Sea. Over the last several years many Tevis Rangers have attended the Teagarden Jazz Camp in Pollack Pines, funded by scholarships from the Basin Street Regulars.

Featured Band: Alpha Rhythm Kings

Established in 2017, the Alpha Rhythm Kings have created quite a stir with music fans, having crafted an exciting, King Size California sound. The "swaggering" (*The Washington Post*) ensemble, led by Robert Dehlinger's "exhilarating" trumpet and "magnetic" singing (*Jazz Corner*) are a favorite with audiences in nightclubs, festivals and concert halls.

You may catch the band entertaining at top jazz venues (Yoshi's in Oakland, Herb Alpert's Vibrato Grill, Blue Note Napa), nightclubs (Feinstein's at the Nikko, 54 Below in Manhattan), exclusive private spots (the French Club, University Club of San Francisco), swanky casinos (the Peppermill in Reno, Nevada, Agua Caliente in Palm Springs, the Orleans and Fontainebleau in Las Vegas), top class hotels (the Hay-Adams in Washington, D.C.), large street fairs (San Francisco's North Beach Festival), and family-friendly theme parks (Disneyland Resort, California's Great America)

Frontman Robert has entertained crowds at many of the USA's most famous locales,

Edwin Carroll Brown born August 2, 1944, moved to Heaven January 18, 2024. Edwin is survived by his adoring wife, Delaine Hiett Brown of Grover Beach, his stepdaughter, Becky Valadez (Pastor Mark), and grandchildren Joziah (Kelly) and Alizabeth Valadez (Ali's foster



son Stormy and his sister, Haisley). Ed is also survived by his four siblings, Edith Poole, Hilda Myatt (Royster), Jerry Brown (Susan), Debbie Barnes (Dr. Bruce). Ed was preceded in death by wives Ann, Sophie and Alice, step-daughter, Dixie and her son Tommy Pitard, Ed's beloved grandson.

Ed joined the United States Army during the Vietnam war and was sent to Fort Irwin in Barstow, California, where he remained. He became a Deputy Sheriff for San Bernardino County, where he retired after 25 years. In 2003 he moved to Arroyo Grande, California with his wife, Alice, until she died in 2011.

Following retirement, Ed filled his time by working at Santa Fe railroad, KMart and the Police Academy at Alan Hancock College. Ed also did many hours of volunteer work for the AGPD and Park Rangers, where he met Lisa Remington, longtime "adopted daughter."

Ed was an avid orchid grower and belonged to the Five Cities Orchid Society. He loved watching leopardy and was always the winner! And he loved watching his favorite teams play ball.

In 2013, at a family gathering where Ed came with his son-in-law, Clinton Hiett (who happens to be Dee's first cousin), Dee asked Ed how she was to get in touch with him when Clint wasn't there?--Ed gave her his phone number and three months later, they were married. Dee were individually honored by AGPD as volunteer of the year. Ed was a member of New Beginnings Community Church of the Nazarene where he volunteered weekly.

Ed and Dee traveled extensively, going on an Alaskan cruise for her retirement, then a Hawaiian cruise and National Parks tour; to North Carolina and Virginia to visit family, Death Valley twice, the Grand Canyon three times, and many other trips for events and celebrations. They enjoyed both parasailing and zip lining.

Ed and Dee enjoyed regularly attending music venues with Unfinished Business, Critical Mass, the Basin Street Regulars, Ramona Gardens, Moose, Eagles and almost every Friday night at Wolff Winery, where they met many good, longtime friends.

Forrest Helmick's Memorial Service

Forrest's memorial service was held in Clovis California on February 18th at 3 PM, in the Veteran's Memorial Building. There were about 115 people in attendance. A table of photos, flowers, one of his horns, mouth pieces, Blue Street jacket were all on display. A chair was set up



with the band with another one of his jackets, a horn and his hat. A larger-than-life photo was on the movie screen behind the podium, it had been taken at the Pismo Beach Veterans Hall. Forrest was born November 11, 1957, and died December 29, 2023.

Dave Ruffner started the service off by welcoming everyone. He introduced the band; Nine Mort was subbing for Sam Rocha who could not be there. Dave also read notes of people who wanted to be there but could not make it. Sherri Colby-Botel made some announcements. Dave led us in prayer and the band played, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." Sheri did a reading from the Book of Psalms, which is a tradition on any Blue Street Gospel set. Sherri sang, "When the Roll is Called Up Yonder." Sherri read Forrest's obituary. Dave then spoke about Forrest's life. Forrest started playing trumpet in the 4th grade, he graduated from high school in 1975. He was the founder of Blue Street Jazz Band in 1983. Dave and Sherri sang, "Mansion Over the Hilltop." Sherri than sang, "Our Love is Here to Stay."

Margo Kipps, Forrest's sister, spoke about



the birth of her baby brother. How much he loved music from the very start. Most kids like a bedtime story before bed, but not Forrest. He wanted to have 6 songs sung to him in the same order every night. Forrest would listen to music all the time. Tamrin Holscher spoke about her mom and Forrest. They

had gone to high school together, were both in the band, but had not dated. Years later they met again, Forrest was saying what a great trumpet player he was, Patrice was like oh really, so Forrest pulled his trumpet out of the trunk



and played her several songs. They started dating and were married in Vegas on July 4th, 2005. Forrest's brother-in-law, Pete Yakovetic, then spoke about Forrest and Patrice and how Forrest won his sister's heart, how strong their love was, and the dedication Forrest had for Patrice. Forrest would always call Patrice just before the gospel sets, they would talk then he would put his phone in his shirt pocket so Patrice could listen to the whole set then he would speak to her after the set. Rick Canfield spoke of Forrest's school days, education and band life. Les Nunes spoke about the college days and college band. Bill McKay talked about Forrest as an educator. Andy Tambagahan spoke of friendship. Dave read some scripture and spoke about how we are pebbles and when thrown in the pond of life our ripples touch each other and how our ripples go on. Forrest created a lot of great ripples in his life and touched many lives. The consensus of the speakers was Forrest was a humble gentle giant among men.

At all the Gospel sets the band would leave the stage except for Jason Wanner and Forrest, then the most beautiful version of "How Great" Thou Art" would be performed. A video from one of the festivals was played. There were a lot of tears shed at this point. A slide show of Forrest life in photos was next. Dave thanked everyone for coming and led us in prayer. The band played, "Nearer My God to Thee." Russ Wright led the walk of somber. Then the umbrellas were out for. "When the Saints Go Marching In." Forrest had a fitting tribute; we all said our goodbyes. Forrest may be gone, but he will live on in our hearts and our minds and all the wonderful music he shared with us. Our personal memories will comfort us until we meet in that giant Second-line in the sky. Rest in Peace our dear friend.
