Prez Says

My father passed away on February 5th. Many of you know this and have expressed your sympathies, which I appreciate.

In the obituary and tribute I wrote, I did not really delve into his musical influences. Both of my parents were great music lovers as adults. Neither of them ever played an instrument. I know that my grandparents on my mother's side had top- of-the line phonograph equipment and many record albums. I really don't know about my father's side, his childhood was punctuated by polio and boarding school.

But when he and my mother got together, she helped him with his music education.

They enjoyed classic musicals and went to the theater to see them live. They traveled together to New Orleans once, and my dad went to Louisiana for some period of time related to his Air Force duties. I know he must have experienced the music.

After Jeff and I became involved with Traditional Jazz as a result of Jeff's parent's association, my parents quickly followed suit. They attended some of the great Southern California festivals; Orange County was their favorite. They became familiar with some of the same bands that we bring here to the Central Coast. My mother bought a lot of CDs, which they played in the car while they were traveling, and she would tell me about the best bands that they saw, and buy me CDs of her latest favorites.

When my mother broke her leg, they were unable to attend a show that I had bought tickets for at the Orange County Performing Arts Center, featuring Jeff Barnhart and another pianist. By this time, I had a relationship with Jeff Barnhart and I asked him to send my mother a get well card, which he graciously did. My dad said to me, somewhat incredulously, "Jeff Barnhart sent your mother a get- well card." "I know", I replied.

While they were still able to travel, they came every year to our backyard "big party", where they held court on the patio table, enjoying the music from an accessible location.

They are happy to be back playing in public for audiences and thrilled to return to the Basin Street Regulars Sunday Session Calendar. Last year we were thrilled to announce that Mrs. Willey was honored with the Kern County Music Educators Jazz Educator Award, honoring excellence in Jazz Education and Performance.

The Tevis Rangers Jazz Ensemble made their debut at BSR as an intermission band in May 2015. This was the first time a junior high school band had ever appeared

BSR Jazz Scholarship Program

BIG THANKS to the BSR board and membership for supporting this scholarship program with an allocation of \$16,000 for 2025. The money will be spent on scholarships for young musicians to attend either the Teagarden Jazz Camp or the Summer Cuesta Jazz Workshop. Last year we gave out 20 scholarships for students from 10 different schools, a total expenditure of \$15,125.29. These students gave rave reviews of their camp experience, eagerly telling us in their thank you letters how much they learned from the professional music instructors as well as what fun they had.

It is a new year, but the BSR objectives are the same. Two of these five objectives are written for and about young musicians.

l To provide young musicians of high school and

college age and other beginners with the opportunity to play along with older and more

experienced musicians.

I To provide musical programs at educational institutions as a means of creating interest in traditional jazz among the youth of the area.

We start advertising the Teagarden Camp and the Cuesta Workshop in January of each year.

By then the music teachers know their students and are ready to write references for students they recommend for our scholarship program. In January 2025 we put together our list of 61 music educators and emailed them the Teagarden Camp Information as well as the BSR Scholarship applications. The Cuesta Jazz Workshop does not post dates for their summer workshop until early spring.

Scholarship information is given out at


each Sunday session to students, parents, teachers, and anyone who is involved with young people who are interested in learning about Jazz. During the school year, we invite school bands to perform as the opening band for these sessions. We pay them a \$200 stipend and pass the hat to give additional funds to their music program. These band students are encouraged to come and play with the jammers before their performance, and we invite and encourage them to come on a regular basis.

Good news, we already have ten scholarship applicants for the Teagarden Jazz Camp, complete with outstanding recommendations from their music teachers. Even more good news, one of our scholarship recipients from the past, Matt Barcus, led the jammers at the February Sunday Session. Matt is now the band instructor for Arroyo Grande High School, his alma mater. His Jazz ensemble also performed for the first time at the February Sunday Session. Thank you Matt!

If you know any young aspiring musicians, please let us know. Help us spread the word about this scholarship opportunity for young musicians. Each scholarship is an \$850 gift of learning from some excellent professional musicians.
